BIRTHDAY BASH

As the dust settles from the 2011 season opener of the Superbike World Championship at the picturesque Phillip Island Circuit, it was a weekend of celebrations both on and off the track.

The 25-27 March event marked the 21st anniversary of the Superbike World Championship at the Victorian circuit, which has remained unchanged since the inaugural running of the Australian event in 1990.

The circuit celebrated with an official birthday cake, which the circuit owner's son Andrew Fox and series promoter Infront Motorsport's Paulo Fiammini cut together.

Circuit manager Peter Mitchell told AMCN that Fox threw a massive after party following the event, where teams, riders, major sponsors and series promoters celebrated under a marquee on the circuit property, with a grand fireworks display the climax of the evening.

As well as a record five Australian riders in the world superbike class and two Aussies in world supersport, both winners of the 1990 Australian round races were also present – but not simply as celebration guests. Peter Goddard as a member of Troy Corser's BMW pit crew, while Robbie Phillis was still pulling on his leathers, finishing second overall in the Historics support class.

"I cannot believe that race happened so long ago, but it was a great race then; I was young and on the gas," Goddard said. "Robbie and I had a great race and there have been some good races here over the years."

"I like the WSBK paddock, it is very friendly and it is a paddock I grew into later, and the series overall is good. It is much more friendly and open than MotoGP. I enjoy working with BMW and hopefully we can get some results for Troy this year as well."

The number of spectators at this year's Australian round of the World Superbike Championship was down compared to previous years, despite the weather remaining clear for Sunday's World Superbike and Supersport races.

There were 63,200 people through the gates over the three-day event, and it was Sunday's entry numbers that let the overall figure down.

It was the eight hours of rain

overnight on Saturday evening that event organisers are touting as the reason behind the deflated attendance.

"It was the people that hadn't pre-purchased their tickets, who woke up in the morning and looked out their window and decided against coming," Phillip Island Circuit manager Peter Mitchell said. "In the end, of course, the day was dry and there was beautiful racing."
