TOUR TIMOR

Timor Adventures is hosting a women-only motorcycle tour through East Timor, highlighting the country's Alola Foundation in its 10th anniversary year.

The 12-day, fully-supported, fully-guided tour kicks off on 29 July from Dili, just a one-hour flight from Darwin, and the price has recently been reduced from \$3400 to \$3060, a saving of 10 percent.

"There are a number of Timorese women who are keen to participate including Alola staff, but for us to be able to subsidise them we will need some paying customers," revealed Timor Adventures' Shirtey Carlos. "I feel very strongly about this as there is great potential for this tour to give a positive message about women, independence and Alola."



The foundation was created to raise awareness of the sexual violence against women and girls in East Timor during the militia attacks of September 1999. Still a key issue, it now also provides a

wide range of support programs for the women and children of the area.
